### New Year...New Job?

What's your New Year's resolution? Is this the year for you to relaunch your career?

**What do you need to do to find that new opportunity?** Is there a gap between the type of position you're interested in and your current skills? Maybe you're not sure. Certainly, having a solid resume that focuses on your quantifiable accomplishments and a robust LinkedIn profile are important tools, but what else is required?
